

Minor Illness and 'Fit for School' - Building Good Attendance Habits for Life

We understand that children sometimes become unwell and are not fit for school and we respect your judgement as parents and carers to decide whether your child is too unwell to attend. However, as a school we cannot authorise absences if although a child is not 100% well, they may be 'fit for school'. Children are expected to attend if they have a minor cold, tiredness, cough, runny nose, headache or tummy ache etc. As a parent or carer, you will know that children often wake up feeling a little tired or groggy but once they are at school and busy they often start to feel better. We would advise you that if you are unsure then send them to school. It is really important to build resilience and good attendance habits for later life. If they deteriorate or cannot manage school activities we will contact you to collect them.

Please do not send your child to school (and for 48 hours afterwards) if they have been vomiting, have diarrhoea or you suspect they may have an infectious disease. If you are unsure please telephone the school office who will be able to advise if an exclusion period applies for certain



illnesses. If your child is not 'fit for school' please contact us on the first day of absence with an explanation of what is wrong and their symptoms ('sick' or 'poorly' is not sufficient for us to consider the absence for authorisation).

We are able to administer <u>prescribed</u> medicines to help children return to school as soon as they are fit to do so. The medicine must be in its original container complete with dispensing label and you must sign a consent form which is available from the office. Thank you.

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Curriculum News

Recently in year 5 and 6 we have been continuing with our space themed learning. In English we have debated, written poems and diary entries. We have increased our English skills by learning about relative clauses/relative pronouns, how to use a semi-colon and how to add parenthesis. We are flying through our book at Cosmic speed and are enjoying all the cliff hangers. To end the theme, we will be writing instructions. In maths we finished adding and subtracting and have moved on to multiplication and division. We have become confident to use the manipulatives to help us visu-

alise our methods of calculating and number recognition. In topic we completed our history study of the space race, then moved on to a country study of America and Russia. We really enjoyed looking at the work of Kandinsky in Art and in particular his work on concentric circles. We are currently finishing our study of planets in science. We looked at the order of the planets in our solar system, day and night and the seasons.

In maths we have been continuing to develop our understanding of addition and subtraction with one exchange.
