Minor Illness and 'Fit for School' - Building Good Attendance Habits for Life

We understand that small children sometimes become unwell and are not fit for school and we respect your judgement as parents and carers to decide whether your child is too unwell to attend. <u>However, as a school we cannot authorise</u> <u>absences if although a child is not 100% well, they may be 'fit for school'</u>. <u>Children are expected to attend if they</u> <u>have a minor cold, tiredness, cough, runny nose, headache or tummy ache etc.</u> As a parent or carer, you will know that children often wake up feeling a little tired or groggy but once they are at school and busy they often start to feel better. We would advise you that if you are unsure then send them to school. It is really important to build resilience and good attendance habits for later life. If they deteriorate or cannot manage school activities we will contact you to collect them.

Please do not send your child to school (and for 48 hours afterwards) if they have been vomiting, have diarrhoea or you suspect they may have an infectious disease. If you are unsure please telephone the school office who will be able to advise if an exclusion period applies for certain illnesses.

If your child is not 'fit for school' please contact us on the first day of absence with an explanation of what is wrong and their symptoms ('sick' or 'poorly' is not sufficient for us to consider the absence for authorisation).

We are able to administer <u>prescribed</u> medicines to help children return to school as soon as they are fit to do so. The medicine must be in its original container complete with dispensing label and you must sign a consent form which is available from the office. Thank you.

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Curriculum News

We have had a fantastic October learning about a whole variety of different things across the school...

Early Years

In Hedgehog Nursery this half term we have been exploring the topic All about Me. We have continued this to talk about our families and homes we live in. When we come back after half term we will be exploring colour.

This month in Monkey Nursery we have continued our core story The Three Little Pigs. The children have loved retelling the story in their play and making their own houses using different materials. In Phonics we have been developing our listening skills, playing lots of listening games and exploring the sounds different instruments make.



In Reception this October we have been learning how to be good friends, how to look after ourselves and keep ourselves healthy by baking bread and making healthy



sandwiches. We have started to learn how to undress and dress ourselves for PE. We have enjoyed exploring the outside area. We have started our number journey looking at numbers 1-5. A big achievement this term has been phonics and how amazing we are at remembering the sounds and reading the words. This is very much a joint partnership between home and school so please ensure you read regularly with your child.

Key Stage 1

This month in Key Stage 1 we have been reading our Core Story, Wild. We have role played the different characters, asked the characters questions, thought about the different feelings of the characters and re-written the story in our own words. In Maths, we have been focusing on Place Value and Addition and Subtraction. We have also been practicing counting forwards and backwards. In Art, we have used our sketching skills to draw detailed pictures of trees and have practiced shading. In Science, we have classified different



animals and talked about their similarities and differences. We have also thought about how to stay clean and healthy in Health and Safety week by talking about hygiene and healthy eating. In Geography, we have been comparing towns and forests and made our own maps.
