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#### Curriculum News

We have had an amazing April learning about a whole variety of different things across the school...

#### Early Years

In Hedgehog Nursery this month we have been learning all about Spring. We have talked about baby animals, painted daffodils and gone on a spring walk. We have used fresh flowers to make self portraits which we could smell and touch flowers and blossom we used.



In Monkeys this month we have also been learning all about Spring. We have talked about the changes we can see outside now and have been on a walk around the school to look for the signs of spring. In Maths we have started looking at sequencing and putting events in order, such as the order we do things to get ready for bed. On Friday 21st April we took part in a dance workshop based around the story 'Handa's Surprise' and the children loved dancing like the different animals.

In Reception we have starting our growing topic and have planted some seeds. We are waiting to see what grows! We have also been watching our tadpoles start to grow. In Maths we have been learning to recognise teen numbers and understanding the value of them. In phonics we are finding out what happens when you add 'ed' to a word.

#### Key Stage 1

In KS1 this month we have been learning about the African Savannah and the animals that live there. We have been writing fact files about lions, thinking about what they look like, where they live and what they eat. In maths, we have been learning about money. We learned about the values of



the coins and notes that we use and started to make amounts using different coins. In art, we have been learning about the artist Edward Tingatinga and can also now name the primary and secondary colours.

#### Reclaim the Rain: Local Flood Prevention & Climate Project

Our school has been selected by the Environment Agency (EA) as part of a pilot project. By working together with our children and families we can lean more about how to help reduce local flooding and win prizes and recognition for the school at the same time, We are looking to achieve the following objectives with your help:

- Engage with a wider audience on flood risk and climate change
- Increase awareness of Local EA projects
- Understand community perceptions on flood risk and climate change
- Encourage conversations about climate change
