This template can be used for multiple purposes:

• It enables schools to effectively plan their use of the Primary PE and sport premium

 It helps schools to meet the requirements (as set out in guidance) to publish information on their Primary PE and sport premium

 It will be an effective document to support Ofsted inspections enabling schools to evidence progress in Physical Education (PE) and evidence swimming attainment, which forms part of the PE National Curriculum. We would recommend schools consider the Intent, Implementation and Impact of any spend, as examined within the Education Inspection Framework.

It is important that your grant is used effectively and based on school need.

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of the PE, School Sport and Physical Activity (PESSPA) they offer. This means that you should use

they offer. This means that you should use the Primary PE and sport premium to:

- Build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years
- Develop or add to the PESSPA activities that your school already offers.

Life coach for Y6 children to boost **SFMH** 

Children – life coach discusses Key indicators 3 & 5: issues they have in their current lives and discusses solutions to them. Often, these solutions can include physical activity or competitive sport as a means to help develop discipline and self-control. As these are key areas of professional sports people, this will help the children when they engage with sports.

The life coach will teach the children practical skills to help them engage in competitive sport and maintain good sportsmanship. These skills will also help with their SEMH needs and self-reflection and selfregulation, directly impacting on their behaviour in school and when engaging in PE lessons or playing sport both within school and within the wider community.

Children will have hetter mental health and have agined strategies to help them with their engagement. This will impact on the physical activities they take part in during their free time and their

sports time.

Purchase of a Yoga/calm space **Children** – The children will have a space to engage with Yoga and other calm. stretch and muscle related activities. Around the space will be books for the children to read. Among these, will be PE and sports books as well as posters/displays on the wall showing muscles and stretches.

### Key indicator 3 & 2:

The calm space can be used for Yoga giving it its own special space in the school. Further to this, the walls of the shed will have some sports and PE books as well as books about sports' personalities. The walls will have posters about muscles and stretches and will encourage the children to live healthily and look after their bodies. This will raise the profile of PE as well as help improve reading within the school.

The children will have better mental health. The children will become more flexible. The profile of PE will be raised within the school whilst addressing a key part of the SIDP.

# Key achievements 2023-2024
