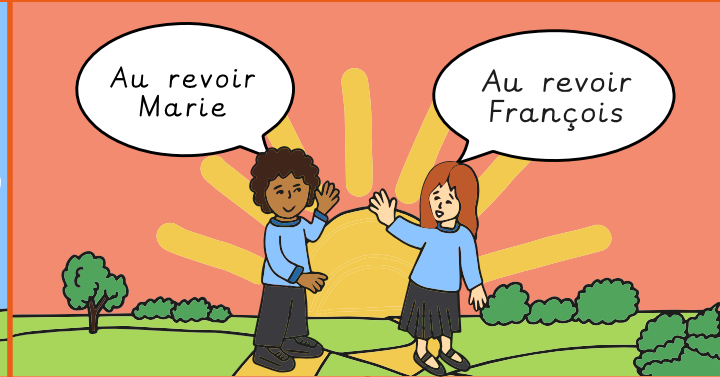


Different types of greetings are used depending on the time of day.

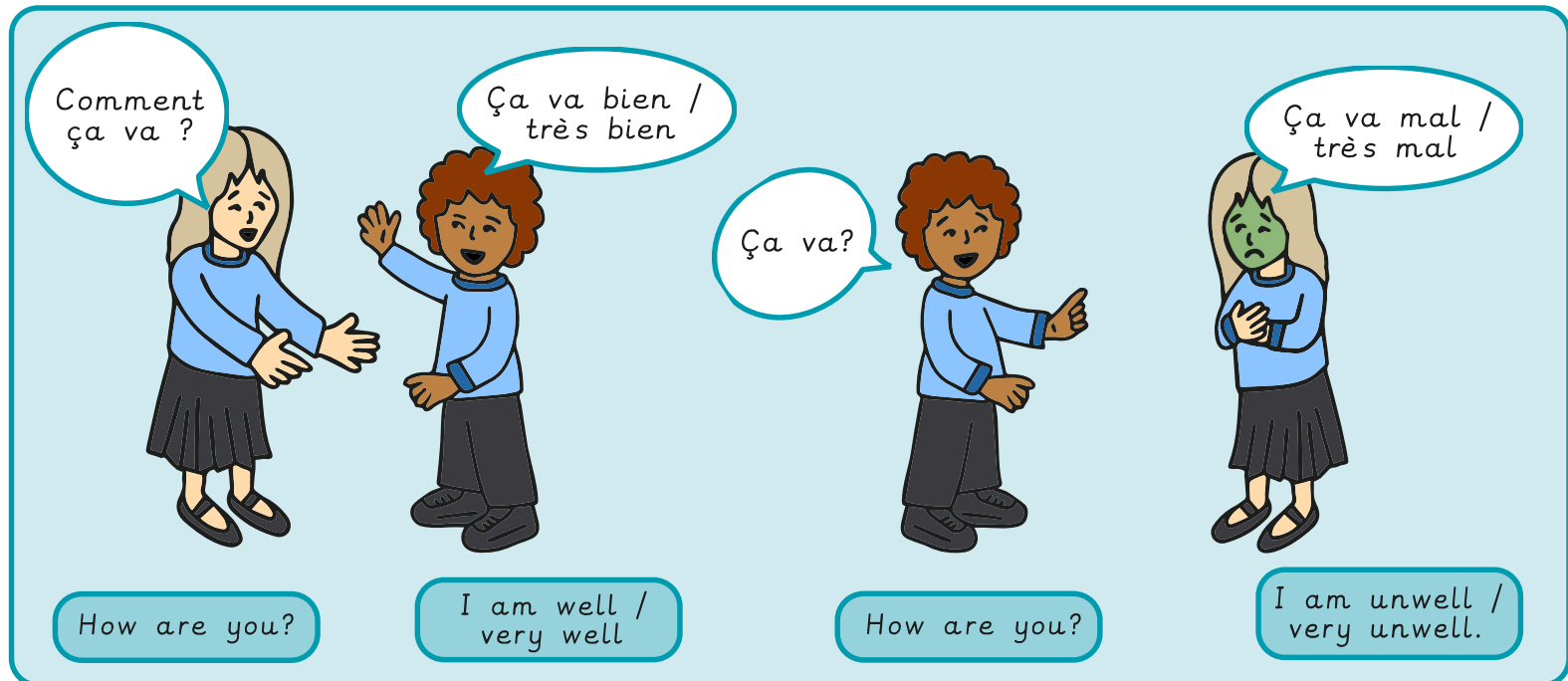
What does the ç cedilla accent do?
