As we reflect on the enriching experiences of this past month in Year 5 and 6, we're delighted to share some of the exciting activities and learning adventures our students embarked upon:

English - In our exploration of "Wolf Brother," our core story, we dived deeper into narrative writing, crafting our own captivating tales inspired by the plot. Additionally, during Book Week, we delved into Joseph Coelho's "Fairytales Gone Bad," igniting creativity as we used the story as an inspiration to write our own twisted fairytales. We even had the privilege of participating in a live online session with Joseph Coelho himself, gaining insight into the world of poetry and the sources of his inspiration. Furthermore, we've been sharpening our grammatical prowess, honing our ability to identify various word classes within sentences.

Maths - has been an adventure this month! We have been enthusiastically engaged in converting units of length, both metric and imperial, as well as units of time. We've also been flexing our mental muscles with timetable calculations, making math not just educational, but fun too!

Creative Arts and Humanities - Exploring our creative sides, we embarked on a week of art, mastering the techniques of drawing with charcoal. Following this, we delved into two weeks of historical discovery, journeying from the Stone Age to the Iron Age. Currently, we're in the first stages of our Design and Technology topic, as we plan and prepare a healthy soup catered to 9-11 year olds.

Life Skills - Safety is paramount, and some of our students have been empowered with essential road safety skills through the Bikeability program.

We are grateful for the patient and encouraging team who facilitated this program, providing invaluable feedback and nurturing our students' confidence on the road. 


